Remove the existing shower head with a wrench or pliers. Wipe down and remove dirt and old tape from the shower arm. Wrap new tape around the threads on the shower arm to prevent leaks. Finally, install the new shower head. Hold the shower arm with one hand and use your other hand to fasten the bracket onto it, rotating in a clockwise direction.

- Connect the utilities



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
